

A THREE-YEAR CAMPAIGN TO GROW THE JOHN JAY INSTITUTE

In 2021-2023, we seek to raise an organizational total of \$2.3 million to sustainably triple the size of the John Jay Fellows program from training and deploying 16 young Christian leaders per year to an organization training and deploying 48 young Christian leaders per year.

The John Jay Fellows program currently supports 8 fellows per semester. Undergirded by a generous lead grant from the Kern Family Foundation, we will renovate our base facility, expand the John Jay Fellows program to 12 fellows, and add a second full John Jay Fellows cohort in Washington, D.C. with the same rigorous curriculum.
